Ah! Great words. Noble words. The kind of lines that look good on a plaque, right next to "Live, Laugh, Love" or "Save Water, Drink Coffee." But then I read the details. Turns out that Zelensky called Modi mainly to explain that if India stopped buying oil from Russia, it would help end the war. In other words, "Dear India, the keys to peace are partly in your pocket." And our Prime Minister responded with, "Yes, there should be peace."

Ah! It's a bit like my neighbour telling me the roof of your house is leaking into his bedroom, and you replying, "Yes, everyone should live in a dry house."

The problem isn't the words-we're very good at words. Oh, we can churn out lofty statements faster than a politician's media team can tweet them. We talk of "peaceful coexistence," "justice for all," "inclusive growth," and "world's largest democracy." The trouble is, the world-and our own people-are beginning to notice that the walk is limping far behind the talk.

Likewise, it's easy to say we're the "world's largest democracy" when speaking at an international summit; it's harder to ensure that dissent is respected, the press is free, and justice isn't selective.

If we don't start matching our actions to our declarations, we'll soon find our credibility slipping away like soap in a slippery bathroom. And believe me, once you've lost credibility, it's very hard to get it back. You can't keep sending opposition delegations abroad to "explain" our position if no one believes our domestic story in the first place.

The world today doesn't just listen-it fact-checks. The moment we make a statement, there are a thousand analysts, journalists, and Twitter users (with more time on their hands than sense in their heads) ready to see if our deeds match our declarations. And if they don't, well-screenshots last forever.

So whether it's stopping wars abroad or ensuring justice at home, the formula is the same: Don't just say it-do it. Let's put our money where our mouth is, or to put it in simpler terms, let's back our words with action. Because words without action are like promises without delivery-they may sound sweet at first, but they leave a bitter aftertaste.

Keymer ahead after day of draws in Chennai chess

All eyes on second half of tournament

Chennai, Aug 12: Grand Masters Vincent Keymer (Germany) and Abhimanyu Puranik (India) maintained their respective lead in the Masters and Challengers section after the fifth round of the Rupees 1 crore prize money Quantbox Chennai Grandmasters 2025 tournament at Hotel Hyatt Regency Chennai.

In the Masters section, GM Erigaisi Arjun with 3.0 points held the sole second place one point behind GM Vincent Keymer. Sharing the third spot with 2.5 points were GMs Anish Giri, Vidit Santosh Gujrathi, Karthikeyan Murali and Awonder Liang.

In the Challengers section, GM Abhimanyu Puranik led with 4.5 points followed by GMs Pranesh M, Diptayan Ghosh and Mendonca Leon Luke at 3.5 points. The Chennai Grand Masters 2025 is sponsored by Quantbox, organised by MGD1 and supported by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

After two losses in a row, former TATA Steel Champion GM Jorden van Foreest turned it around defeating American GM Ray Robson in a marathon game that went past four hours lasting 82 moves. An exchange sacrifice in Queen's Gambit Declined Exchange Variation game by Robson 27...Rxf3

steered the game into complications. At half way stage, Jorden's rook and three pawns looked a little inadequate to put it across Robson's knight and four pawns. The evaluation pendulum kept swinging either way before the Dutch Grandmaster stepped it up and finally the material imbalance did the American in.

On an otherwise peaceful day, rest of the games Karthikeyan - Giri, Vidit - Keymer, Erigaisi - Pranav, Liang - Nihal ended in draws. The second half of the tournament should give more fighting games for the paying public with the title, FIDE circuit points and handsome prize money on line.

The Challengers section, saw two games viz., Vaishali - Harshvardhan, Harika - Puranik ending favorably for black. In pursuit of the title, Abhimanyu Puranik would be looking to increase his not so big one point lead with four rounds to go. And, a fourth defeat in five games for Harika will increase the pressure on the three time world championship bronze medalist to turn it around. International Master Harshvardhan G B delivered his first win scoring over GM Vaishali Rameshbabu where white kept pressed way too hard eventually going down.
